



Data availability was incomplete and only able to be remedied by institutions. Stakeholder Expectations



Prioritization of Features




Working with external institutions to update and fix data was out of the timeline.




Use an Agile Approach

By adopting an agile development approach, we enabled the team to adapt to changes in a controlled manner, ensuring the project remains focused and manageable while evolving dynamically.



Strategic Prioritization of Features

It is important to distinguish between essential 'must-have' features and desirable 'nice-to-have' elements, ensuring that project expansion aligns with core objectives and remains feasible.



Effective stakeholder touchbases

Engaging stakeholders is critical, especially high-level leadership, in setting realistic expectations and incorporating their feedback into the project strategically.

It is necessary to have clear communication of the project roadmap and priorities, emphasizing the importance of outlining objectives, timelines, and the logic behind feature

It is important to be upfront about project scope, timelines, and budget from the start, and educating stakeholders on the consequences of scope creep for successful project

The importance of visual tools like Gantt charts for clarifying project timelines and the role of regular feedback loops and iterative reviews in early detection and management of scope
